For the first few weeks, you will work on writing a solid paragraph.

August 20:

A paragraph focuses on one topic and often includes a sentence with the main idea. We often call this the introductory sentence. Sometimes authors put the main idea sentence at the end of the paragraph instead. Your goal today is to identify the topic of the paragraph and the main idea sentence.

First you will **read** the paragraph carefully and then ask yourself what is the topic of this paragraph? Write it down.

Once you find the topic, you are ready to find the main idea. The main idea is the point of the paragraph. It is the **most important** thought about the topic.

To figure out the main idea, ask yourself this question: What is being said about the person, thing, or idea (the topic)?

The author can locate the main idea in different places within a paragraph. The main idea is usually a sentence and is often the first sentence, but it can be found anywhere. The writer then uses the rest of the paragraph to support the main idea.

Today you will complete the next three pages and check your answers. Be honest as you are self-evaluating. Great students learn from their errors. When you get an answer wrong, do not just write the correct answer in its place, but mark it wrong. You should then return to the directions and read them again before you select your answer. You will need to show me the completed work so put a post-it tab on the next page so it is easy for you to find.

You should recall that paragraphs focus on one main idea. They should contain a topic sentence. Paragraphs also contain details. Most teachers like to see a minimum of three supporting details per paragraph. Be aware that these details need to add and support the main idea.

Directions:

First read the paragraph. Then underline the main idea of the paragraph. Then put a "1" in front of the first supporting idea, a "2" in front of the second supporting detail, etc... Cross out any supporting ideas that do not support the main idea. These paragraphs have concluding sentences as their last sentence in the paragraph. We will work on concluding sentences tomorrow, so just know that you should not underline, number, or cross out the last sentence. Check your work when you are finished. Put a tab on the page so you can find it quickly.

So far you have practiced finding the topic and main idea sentence of a paragraph. You also learned how find supporting details in a paragraph. Yesterday, you noticed that paragraphs often have a concluding sentence as well. Today, you will focus on concluding sentences. Concluding sentences typically reinforce the main idea of the paragraph. They also serve as a transition to the next paragraph in an essay with many paragraphs. Obviously, concluding sentences are easy to spot since they are the last sentence in a paragraph. They are, however, tricky to write. Most writers are ready to move on to the next topic and forget to write a concluding sentence, but concluding sentences are important to the reader. The concluding sentence lets the reader reflect on the information presented in the paragraph and prepares the reader to transition to a new thought.

Directions: Read the paragraph. Identify the main idea sentence and the supporting details.

Notice that each sentence in the paragraph is not a NEW supporting detail. Sometimes the author expands the supporting detail. Be careful, one detail does not equal one sentence. Often an author needs two or more sentences to properly convey a detail. Cross out any detail that does not support the main idea. Then select the best concluding sentence for the paragraph. Check your work carefully and put a tab on your work so it is easily found when you show me your completed work.
