Cereal Box Book Report



Students will decorate a real cereal box with the illustrations and information related to the one of the ancient civilizations we have studied: India, Egypt, Greece, Roman, Sumerians, etc...using the directions below. I expect a lot of time, effort, and hard work to be put into these reports, not for them to be completed sloppily in one night. I also will expect all directions to be followed, so a copy of the rubric that will be used to grade the report has been attached.

**You will want to cover the entire box with a light colored paper. I recommend to NOT write directly on the covered box, but to rather, measure the area carefully and create a template. I will model this in class. **

FRONT OF BOX: Include the name of the cereal and a picture illustrating one of the important ideas of that civilization. Invent a name for the cereal that is related to the name of the civilization and sounds like a cereal. Do not use the exact name of the civilization. Choose a shape for the cereal as well as colors and ingredients that all related to the civilization. For example, Ancient Egypt, you could name it Egyptian Edible Yum-Yums and have the shape of the cereal be a pyramid, a crown, mummies, and marshmallow gems. (you are not providing any real cereal)

TOP HALF OF BACK OF BOX: Design a game that teaches about the civilization. It can be a puzzle, word search, word scramble, maze, crossword puzzle, hidden picture illustration, matching game, or any other fun activity that might be found on the back of a cereal box. Make sure it includes information from your civilization.

BOTTOM HALF OF BACK OF BOX: Include a map of your civilization. It must be labeled correctly and neatly.

<u>RIGHT SIDE:</u> Instead of ingredients on the side, write a timeline with pictures.

LEFT SIDE: Write an overview of your civilization that describes it - this should be a paragraph that highlights the most important aspects of your civilization.

TOP OF BOX: Include your civilization and the time it flourished and a one sentence grabber (example Egypt was land of pharaohs, pyramids, and mummies.) Give the civilization a rating - the maximum number of stars would be five.

PRIZE: Cereal boxes often include a prize. Your prize must be a homemade artifact from your civilization. You can even include a picture of the prize on the front of the box to let the reader know what is inside the box. (for example for the Egyptian Edibles Yum-Yums you could include an amulet)
